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this fascinating and wide ranging book charts developments in the teaching and study of handwriting over the course of the twentieth century the book shows how changing educational policies economic forces and inevitable technological advance have combined to alter the priorities and form of handwriting this long and sometimes sorry story tells also of the sheer pain and hard work of children forced to follow the style of the day and of the reformers who have sought to simplify the teaching and learning of

handwriting over the years illustrated throughout with examples from copybooks and personal handwriting from across the world the book is a compelling historical record of techniques styles and methods

first published in 1987 handwriting reviews theory and research on handwriting and on children who have handwriting problems and draws out principles and recommendations for practitioners the practitioners will include teachers educational advisors psychologists and occupational and physical therapists there has been a revival in the teaching of the basic school skills of reading writing and number surprisingly however there are very few books concerning the manipulative skills of handwriting and this book seeks to fill this major gap while much of the book is concerned with the development and teaching of handwriting skills in ordinary children it also gives detailed consideration to the problems encountered by children with physical disabilities this is an interesting read for students of education

from the simple representative shapes used to record transactions of goods and services in ancient mesopotamia to the sophisticated typographical resources available to the twenty first century users of desktop computers the story of writing is the story of human civilization itself calligraphy expert ewan clayton traces the history of an invention which ever since our ancestors made the transition from a nomadic to an agrarian way of life in the eighth century bc has been the method of codification and dissemination of ideas in every field of human endeavour and a motor of cultural scientific and political progress he explores the social and cultural impact of among other stages the invention of the alphabet the replacement of the papyrus scroll with the codex in the late roman period the perfecting of printing using moveable type in the fifteenth century and the ensuing spread of literacy the industrialization of printing during the industrial revolution the impact of artistic modernism on the written word in the early twentieth century and of the digital switchover at the century s close the golden thread also raises issues of urgent interest for a society living in an era of unprecedented change to the tools and technologies of written communication chief

among these is the fundamental question what does it mean to be literate in the early twenty first century the book belongs on the bookshelves of anyone who is inquisitive not just about the centrality of writing in the history of humanity but also about its future it is sure to appeal to lovers of language books and cultural history
